The old vines and more recent plantings all produce exceptional fruit that's healthy and balanced – the wines are fresh and bright, but with complexity and depth; layered, just like the site on which they grow. Our vines are our family and our wines have been recognised for more than 40 years.

HUGO Cabernet Sauvignon 2021

The Hugo Cabernet Sauvignon is planted right at the top of the estate against the McLaren Vale foothills. Due to this unique location conditions are markedly cooler due to the elevation and gully breezes. This results in a longer ripening period and more elegant Cabernet with generous mouth feel, aromatics and fine soft tannins.

Tasting Note Medium bodied, black fruits of blackcurrant, black cherry accompanied by a hint of chocolate, violet and sage. Balanced Cabernet fruit, with a rich middle palate and fine soft tannins.

Vintage The 2021 growing season started with a wet winter and spring followed by a mild and dry summer. With no heat spikes and lower temperatures throughout summer, ripening was slow and gradual allowing the fruit to develop intensity of flavour. A truly special vintage in McLaren Vale.

Vineyard Estate grown Hugo Cabernet Sauvignon planted by John and Liz Hugo on the elevated Hugo Estate.

Importantly 40% of this wine is from a new clone of cabernet called Entav planted in 2015 right by our cellar door, which offers greater aromatics then other cabernet clones and we think has great potential.

Winemaking Fermented on skins for 7 days with gentle pumpovers twice per day. Maturation in predominately French oak hogsheads & larger format French oak puncheons for 16 months. 15% New oak.
